1. Two-day workshop on Business Analytics - 24th & 25th August

A Two-day workshop on “Business Analytics” by Make intern in association with Echoes 2k18-19 IIM-Kozhikode was organised on 24th & 25th August 2018. The speaker for the session was Mrs. Maneesha Shukla, Analytics Mentor.

On the first day of the workshop, she enlightened the students on the concept Business and differentiated between Analysis and analytics (Analysis + statistics= Analytics). Basically business analytics is the science of analysing complex business data by statistics, data mining, computer technology etc. The process of analytics involves

Gather data Organize data (data mining, filtering and clearing) and Analyse data

A quiz was conducted up to the topics covered.

Analytics is applicable in each and every field. The Application areas of Analytics & its stages were focused.

Then a debate was conducted on “Is Business of business the only business”

The students were taken to management lab to download R software in the systems.

On the second day of the session, few important terms were emphasized which includes

Big Data – It is the term use to describe collection of data that is huge in size yet growing exponentially with time. Challenges faced while collecting big data & 5 V’s of Big data & its advantages & approaches to solve the big data followed by Components of data analysis i.e. Data mining, Data visualization, Data instruction and data analysis.

Data scientist language (tools) - R, SAS, Python, SQL

Data dictionary - It describes the structure of database itself. It helps in analyzing different data variable and their relationship between each other.

It includes 1. Number of records 2. Name of each fields.

Outlier treatment - Outlier is an observation that deviates significantly from other observation due to experimental error or special circumstances.

Data collection

1. Qualitative data (categories)

2. Quantitative data (numbers)

Collecting relevant data, categorizing the data and organizing the data.

Statistical methods used in Business Analytics.

Descriptive Statistics à simple (mean, median and mode), Measure of actual tendency, Measures of dispersion

Inferential statistics à Population, Estimation, Hypothesis testing.

Assigning Probability by Relative frequency method, Subjective method, classical method

A quiz was conducted up to the topics covered.

She has thrown light on null & alternative hypothesis & highlighted the Test of significance with 2 types i.e. one sided & Two sided using statistical methods like chi square test, ANOVA, Correlation etc. Then brought the importance of Data Mining, Business Intelligence, Market Basket Analysis and differentiated between differential and prediction market basket analysis.

Then the students were taken to Management lab for practical application of “R” software which motivated the students.

The students were highlighted with the commands in R – how to name a data, to make simple statistics like i.e. Min, Max, Range, Mean, Median, IQR, Standard Deviation, Variance, Correlation, ANOVA, T- test, to make a graph/plot, box plot between 2 variables and to make a histogram of a single variable.

Then a debate was conducted on statistical methods Vs statistical tools.

At the end of the second day, she evaluated the students based on quiz and debate which were conducted on both the days of the workshop. Considering these 2 aspects, 5 students got selected out of total 45 students. The 5 students were

3. Teaching Skills & Strategies in English Language Classroom: 28.02.2019.

The Department of English has organized one day State level Workshop on Teaching Skills and Strategies in English Language Classroom, to provide a reasonable adequate theoretical perspective and plausible pedagogical guidelines for the professional growth.

The opening session has started with the welcoming the august audience and introducing the resource persons. The first session was taken up by Dr.A.Rama Naga Hanuman, Asst.Professor, Dept. of English, Central University of Hyderabad. He discussed on “English Language and Literature; Theory to Praxis”. He explained the importance of language through the different genres of literature, i.e. Drama, Poetry, Fiction and Prose.

The Second session was conducted by Dr.B.Brahmananda Chary, Principal (Retd) Vijay Nagar College of Commerce. He emphasized on the importance of “Vocabulary Skills” that a robust vocabulary improves all areas of communication. These can be learnt through the method of drill and practice. When we learn about the root words, prefixes and suffixes they are able to figure out many new words. Looking at the origin of words, words from other language increases word as well as worldly knowledge.

The post lunch session was taken up by Prof.C.Murali Krishna, Chairman, Board of Studies, Osmania University on “Presentation Skills”. He explained that presentations are a fantastic way to contribute towards English language learning experience. We have to keep in mind the size and nature of the audience, surroundings, facilities available, the type of presentation (lecture style, informative, participative etc.) and also be aware of the body language which can influence the degree of anxiety, but they are not the casual factors.

Finally, the workshop was concluded by taking the valuable feedback from the audience and proposing vote of thanks by Ms.N.Karuna Sree.

4. Workshop on Cyber Security & Ethical Hacking: 8&9.04.2019.

The Dept. of Computer Science in collaboration with zonalchampionship.com and Shaastra ,IIT Madras conducted two days’ workshop on “ Cyber security and Ethical Hacking” in the auditorium. Sri Ramakrishnan Natraj, Director, White hat Global Academy was the resource person. He explained about the theoretical concepts of Information security, Security Guide lines, Encryption, Digital certificates and Digital signatures, Cryptography tools, Child online safety, Identity Theft and social Engineering.
