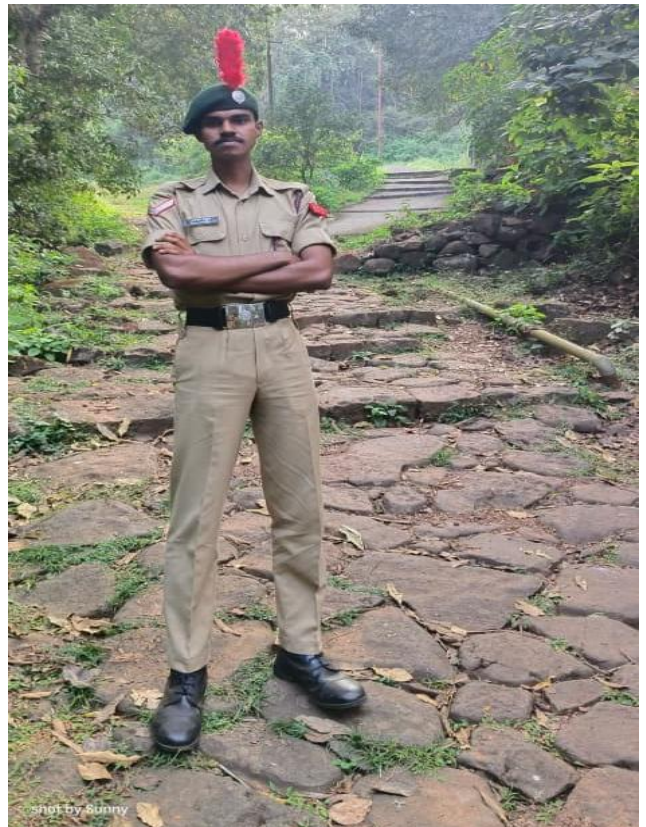
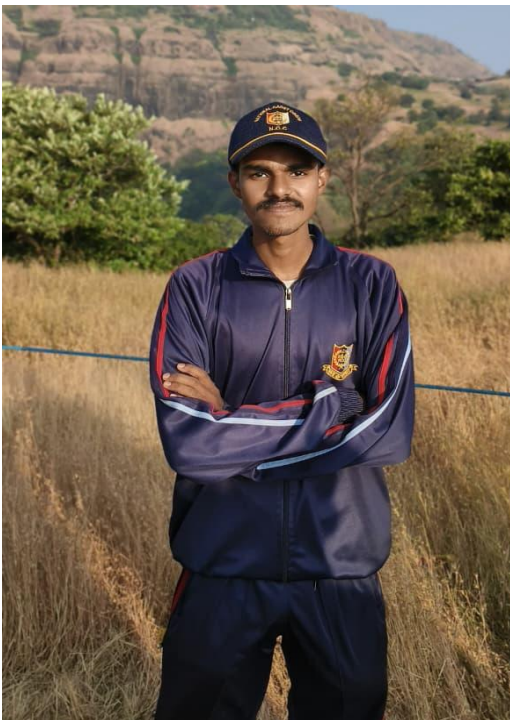


3. SHIVAJI TRAIK TREKKING CAMP :-

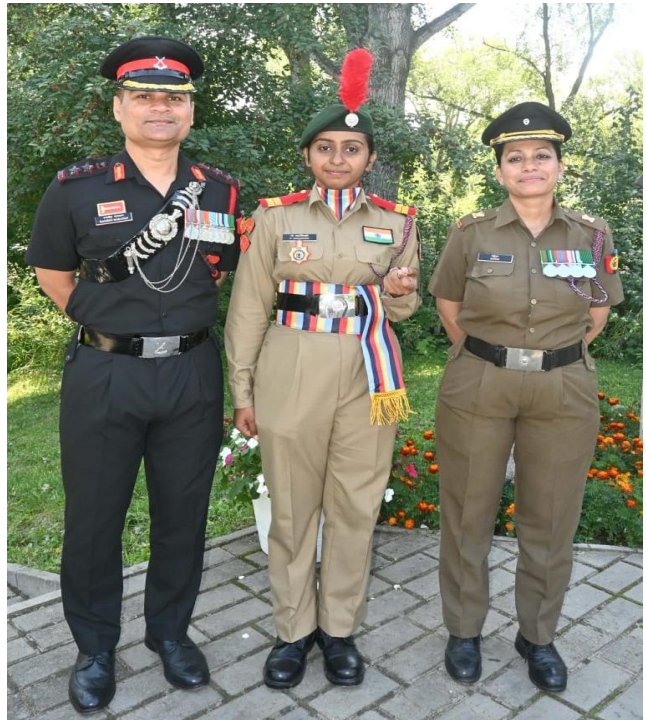


8. YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM :-

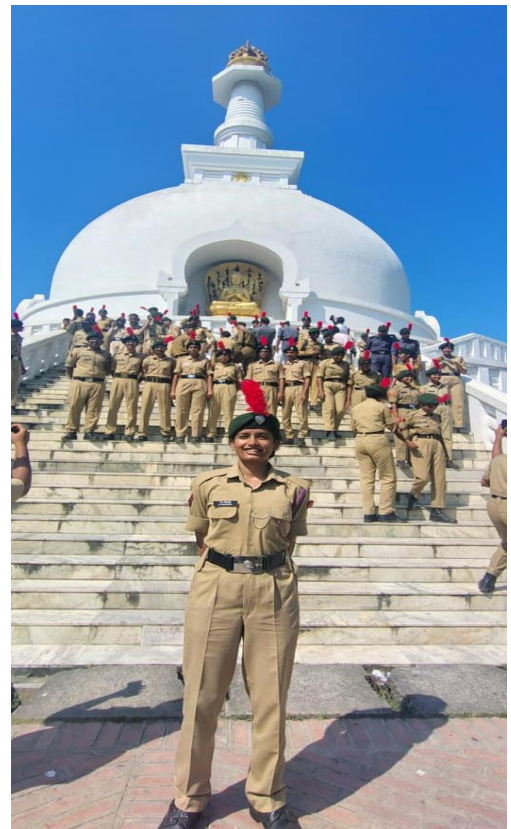


11. EK BHARAT SHRESHTHA BHARAT CAMP-II :-
